The Fokker D.II has seen regular service, be it mainly on the Eastern fronts and has been rather fast phased out to a training function. In the references the factory designation is quite univocal given as M.17Z, a double bay biplane equipped either with warping control (ZF) or ailerons (ZK). Only Engels (ref. 10) reports it as the single bay M.17E, which is not confirmed by the photographs in other sources.



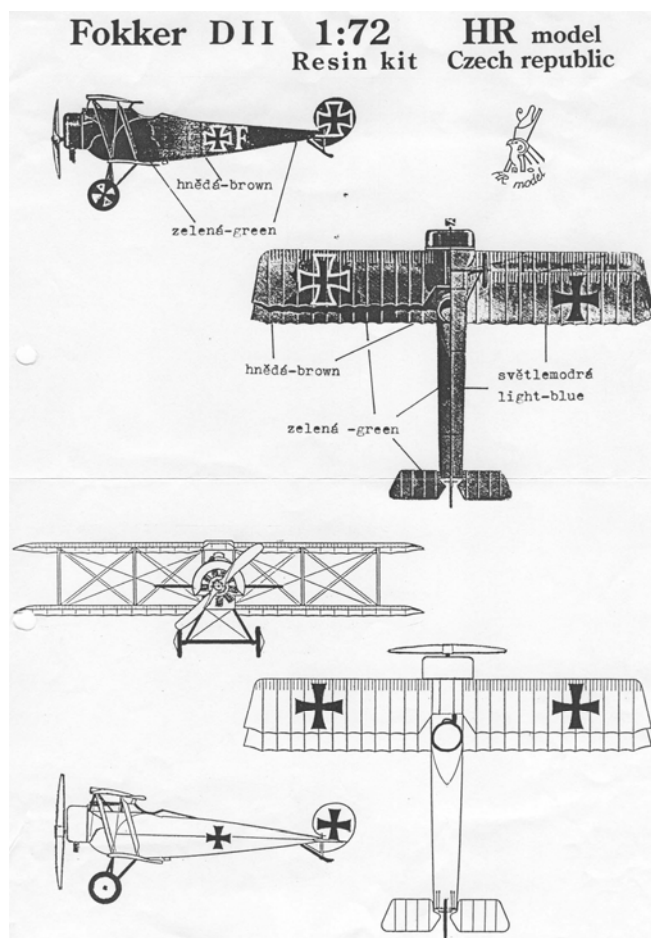

The kit contains resin parts, a small plastic sheet with a print of the instrument panel dials, photo-etched parts for cockpit steps, instrument panel, propeller hub and (if desired) detailing of the machine gun screens, decals and an instruction sheet. The instruction sheet includes a three-view drawing and painting instructions for the camouflage scheme.

Dimensions are given in the table. Engels (ref. 4 and 5), Leaman (ref. 7) and Weyl (ref. 8) present a three-view drawing.
