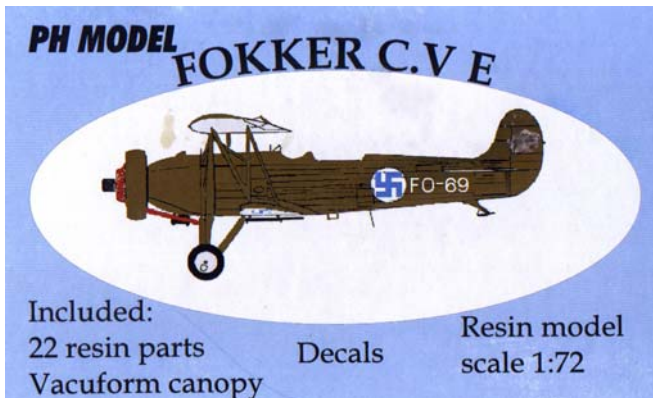


Fokker C.V E PH Model resin kit

Sesquiplane strategic reconnaissance, light bomber

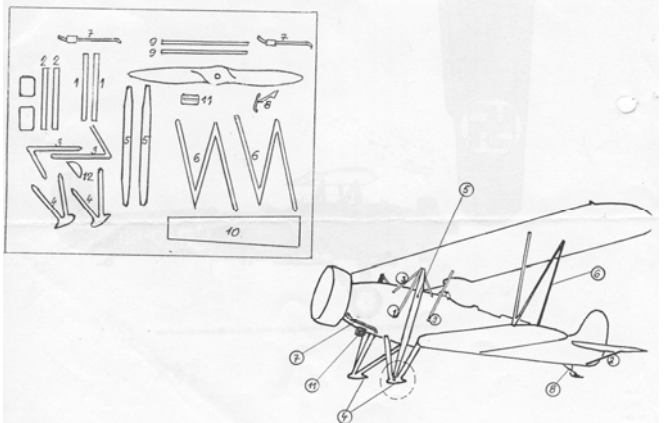
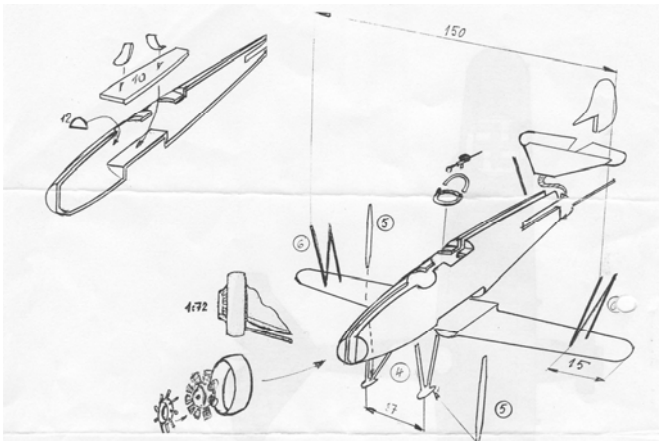

The Fokker C.V E was the strategic reconnaissance version of the upgraded C.V. Due to the larger span and weight of the aircraft the inter-wing struts were N-styles and the landing gear legs were supported by a long style to the top wing. The fuselage was the same as that of the C.V D. Again, the aircraft could be equipped by various engines (Hispano-Suiza, Lorraine-Dietrich, Napier Lion, Bristol Jupiter and Pegasus). The plane has been license produced in Italy as the Romeo Ro.1



The kit comes in a sturdy box and contains resin parts, a vacuum formed (?) windshield and decals for the Finish version of the C.V E with Bristol Jupiter VI engine.

The instruction sheet shows a couple of two-view drawings of the aircraft, a drawing of the resin parts contained in the box and three drawing indicating the location of the parts. There are painting instructions on one of the sheets; they specify olive green for the upper surfaces and light grey for the lower surfaces. I have used Humbrol 155 (Matt Olive Drab) for the upper and side parts of the fuselage and the upper tail and wing surfaces and Humbrol 23 (Duck Egg Blue) for the lower surfaces.



Alting (ref. 1), Geldhof (ref. 2), Hegener (ref. 3), Hooftman (ref. 4, 5 and 6), Postma (ref. 7), Wesselink (ref. 8), Vliegwereld (ref. 9) and Fokker Bulletin (ref. 10) list the dimensions of the C.V E. Fokker Bulletin also reproduces a three-view drawing.
